

## Suggested Itinerary

### Introduction

At the moment there aren't any companies that provide luggage transfer. The companies that offer this service for self guided long distance walks tend to use taxis. These actually cost £15 to £25 which is of course included in the package cost. Taxis can usually be booked by your accommodation provider.

Currently and largely due to Covid Pandemic there is a shortage of accommodation in certain parts of the first half of the route. This is particularly true at the start. ### Possible Itinerary

Day 1 Starting from Greenfield (or Holywell if you have arrived the previous day) and walk to either to Tremeirchion or St Asaph. (But see below)\* This is not recommended in the shorter daylight hours.

Day 2 Tremeirchion to Llansannan or Gwytherin

Day 3 Walk to Llangernyw area

Day 4 Walk to Rowen area

Day 5 Walk to Llanfairfechan

Day 6 Walk to Bangor

Day 7 Walk to Llanberis

Day 8 Walk to Y Fron

Day 9 Walk to Clynog Fawr/Trefor\*\*

Day 10 Walk to Nefyn

Day 11 Walk to Tudweiliog Area

Day 12 Walk to Aberdaron

\*This makes Day 1 a long day. To do the walk to St Asaph over two days a possibility is to spend an extra night in Holywell. This would mean walking to Trelawnyd and catching a bus back to Holywell. There are three alternatives

(1) Bus 19 at 14 25 from Trelawnyd – Monday to Friday

(2) Fflecsi Bus, this is a service that has to be booked in advance via their app or telephone 0300 234 0300. This service is available until 6 pm Monday to Saturday. By downloading the app you allow the driver to update and contact you if you are not at the planned pick up point on time

(3 ) by taxi

The following day catch Bus 19 to Trelawnyd to continue your walk. This service is available in the mornings Monday to Saturday

\*\* The area from Trefor to Aberdaron is also covered by a Fflecsi Service
